Matthew Lewans is an Assistant Professor of Law at the University of Alberta, where he teaches administrative law, jurisprudence, and professional responsibility. Called to the Bar of Saskatchewan in 1998, he practiced for several years before pursuing graduate studies in law at the University of Oxford, the University of Auckland, and the University of Toronto. His research interests lie in the areas of administrative law, jurisprudence, legal history, and legal theory, and he has been an invited lecturer on recent developments in Canadian administrative law with the Canadian Institute for the Administration of Justice and the National Judicial Institute. His upcoming book, entitled *Administrative Law and Judicial Deference*, explores the legitimacy of administrative law and the common law doctrine of judicial deference from historical, comparative, and theoretical perspectives.
