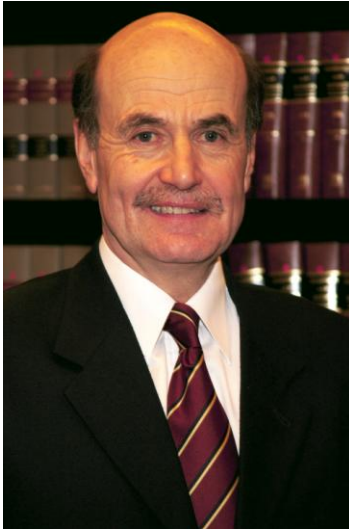


## Daniel Ish



Daniel Ish, Q.C., is the Chief Adjudicator of the Indian Residential Schools Adjudication Secretariat (Canada). He was a professor of law at the University of Saskatchewan and McGill University, and served as dean of law at the University of Saskatchewan from 1982-88, 1996-97, and again from 2002-04 (a total of nine years). He is a member of both the Saskatchewan and Alberta Bars. Mr. Ish has taught and written on many areas of law in Canada and abroad, and has been an active arbitrator and mediator. He was a Fulbright Fellow at Stanford University in 1995-96, and he has done extensive international work, particularly advising on legal reform projects in numerous developing countries. Other activities of Mr. Ish include being a bencher of the Law Society of Saskatchewan (1982-88; 2002-2004), the Chair of the Saskatchewan Legal Education Society Inc. (2003-2006), a trustee of the Law Foundation of Saskatchewan (1982-1988;2002-2004), Treaty Land Entitlement arbitrator for Saskatchewan (1991 to present), currently a public member (adjudicator) for both the Investment Dealers Association and the Mutual Fund Dealers Association, and the Chair of the Prairie Region Panel of the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council.
